

Bessie Dendrinou



Professor Emeritus at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens, Greece, she is Director of the University's Research Centre for Language Teaching and Assessment (RCeL). Since 2003, she is President of the Examination Board of the KPG national examinations in Greece, and has been a member of the team that developed this multilingual examination suite that tests language competences in six languages (English, French, German, Italian, Spanish and Turkish) on the 6-level scale of the Council of Europe. Her research interests lie primarily in foreign language pedagogy, curriculum and materials development, plurilingual competence and cross language mediation, language testing and assessment, but her keen interest in socially accountable applied linguistics has also led her to investigate linguistically construed gender ideology, the linguistic representations of poverty, and the bureaucratic discourse in Greek public documents. Her publications appear in English and Greek, but her work, including *The Hegemony of English*, co-authored with Donaldo Macedo and Panagiota Gounari (which received the 2004 American Educational Studies Association Critics' Choice Award in the USA), has also appeared in Spanish and Portuguese. A delegate of the European Federation for the National Institutes for Language on the ECSPM for which she was elected president in 2014.
