Professor in Linguistics at the Universidad Autónoma (Madrid, Spain), Member of the International Pragmatic Association Consultation Board (re-elected for the period 2012-2017), and President of the Iberian Association for Studies on Discourse and Society (EDiSo). She directs the consolidated interdisciplinary research conducted by the UAM group in Multilingualism, social identities, intercultural relations and communication (MIRCO). Her research focuses on multilingualism and language contact, critical discourse analysis, interactional analysis and intercultural communication. Her most recent work is the edited volume *Occupy: The spatial dynamics of discourse in global protest movements* (Benjamins, 2016), and her books include *Constructing inequality in multilingual classrooms* (Mouton de Gruyter, 2010), *Voices from the classroom. Immigration and linguistic diversity* (Madrid: CIDE), co-edited with L. Mijares in 2007, and *¿Asimilar o integrar? Dilemas ante el multilingüismo en las aulas* (Madrid: CIDE) in 2003. She is on the editorial committee of several journals, including *Discourse & Society*, *Language and Politics*, and *Multicultural Discourses*.
