

Robert Phillipson



Professor Emeritus at Copenhagen Business School. He worked for the British Council from 1964-73 and moved to Denmark in 1973, where he taught for many years at Roskilde University. His books on language learning, linguistic imperialism, language policy, and linguistic human rights have been published in eleven countries. He is best known for *Linguistic Imperialism* (Oxford UP 1992, also published in India and China, and in translation into Arabic and Japanese). *Linguistic Imperialism* continued (Routledge, 2009) assesses the continued dominance of English and the implications for other languages. *English-only Europe? Challenging language policy* (Routledge 2003) argues for EU language policy to take diversity more seriously and suggests ways of achieving this. Among his recent works is an authoritative four-volume collection, entitled *Language Rights*, co-edited with Tove Skutnabb-Kangas, 2016, containing texts on language rights, principles and practices as these have evolved over the past century. In 2010, Robert was awarded the UNESCO Linguapax prize.
