Professor in Linguistics at the University of Vienna, Austria, and Emeritus Distinguished Professor and Chair in Discourse Studies at Lancaster University. Together with her colleagues and students, she elaborated on the Discourse Historical Approach. Co-founding editor of the book series *Discourse Approaches to Politics, Society and Culture*, she is also co-editor of journals dealing with discourse and society, and the language of politics. In 1996, she was awarded the Wittgenstein-Preis for her projects (on Discourses on Un/employment in EU organizations; The Discursive Construction of European Identities; Attitudes towards EU-Enlargement; Racism at the Top. Parliamentary Debates on Immigration in Six EU countries; The Discursive Construction of the Past: Individual and Collective Memories of the German Wehrmacht and the Second World War). In October 2006, she was awarded the Woman's Prize of the City of Vienna and, in 2008 she was awarded the Kerstin Hesselgren Chair of the Swedish Parliament. In December 2011, she was presented her with the Grand Decoration of Honour in Silver for Services to the Republic of Austria and in 2013 she was elected member of the British Academy of Social Sciences.
