

## Suzanne Romaine



Merton Professor of English Language at the University of Oxford since 1984. Prior to this, she was senior research scientist in Linguistic Anthropology, at the Max-Planck-Institut-für-Psycholinguistik, Nijmegen, Netherlands, and Lecturer in Linguistics at the University of Birmingham, England. In 1998 she was awarded an honorary doctorate from the University of Tromsø in Norway, and in 1999 she was awarded an honorary doctorate from the University of Uppsala in Sweden. She has held a variety of scholarships and visiting fellowships at other universities in Europe and North America.

Her research interests lie primarily in historical linguistics and sociolinguistics, especially in problems of societal multilingualism, linguistic diversity, language change, language acquisition, and language contact in the broadest sense. She was a member of the UNESCO Expert Group that produced UNESCO's position paper on *Education in a Multilingual World*. (Paris: UNESCO, 2003). She also authored a backgrounder paper on Languages and Cultural Identities for *Investing in Cultural Diversity and Intercultural Dialogue* (Paris: UNESCO, 2009).
