

## Tove Skutnabb-Kangas



Dr. phil. from the University of Roskilde, Denmark, she is a retired professor, associated with Åbo Akademi University Vasa, in Finland. A pioneer in the field of linguistic human rights, she has recently co-edited, with Robert Phillipson, an authoritative four volume collection, entitled *Language Rights*, to appear in 2016, with 95 texts on language rights principles and practices as these have evolved over the past century, and their anchoring in international and national legislation. It is a multidisciplinary work, drawing on language policy, political theory, education, law, philosophy, anthropology, economics, minority studies, deaf studies, and indigenous cosmologies. Tove Skutnabb-Kangas is both a passionate scholar and activist in the fields of linguistic human rights and minority education. She has written or edited over 50 books and over 400 articles published in 48 languages on minority education, multilingualism, linguistic human rights, linguistic genocide, ecolinguistics, and the subtractive spread of English.
