

Nikolay Slavkov is Full Professor and Research Chair in Language Policy at the Official Languages and Bilingualism Institute (OLBI) of the University of Ottawa. He is also former Director of the Canadian Centre for Research and Studies in Bilingualism and Language Planning (CCERBAL). He is interested in bilingualism and multilingualism from various perspectives, including social, policy-related, pedagogical, linguistic, and psychological. His recent work has focused on language pedagogy and innovation, technology, childhood language development, language attrition, family language policy, and

decolonization. Prof. Slavkov's research contributions include keynote addresses, edited volumes, journal articles, and book chapters. His work has appeared in journals such as The Canadian Modern Language Review, International Journal of Multilingualism, International Journal of Bilingual Education and Bilingualism, Foreign Language Annals, Second Language Research, Immersion Journal, Canadian Journal of Applied Linguistics, TESL Canada, Lingua, and Journal of Slavic Linguistics as well as in book collections by Cambridge University Press, John Benjamins, Mouton/De Gruyter, Palgrave, and Springer. Prof. Slavkov participates as a Principal Investigator and as Co-Investigator in various projects funded by the Canadian Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council, by Canadian Heritage, and by European granting institutions. He has previously served as editor-in-chief of the bilingual English/French journal *Cahiers de l'ILOB / OLBI Journal*. Prof. Slavkov has taught and mentored students and young researchers in Canada, the United States, China, Austria, and Bulgaria.
